



INTRODUCTION

The University of Zimbabwe Faculty of Medicine & Health Sciences (UZ-FMHS) Research Support Centre (RSC) was founded in 2010, with multifunding from the Wellcome Trust (UK) (Southern Consortium of Research Excellence Africa (SACORE) programme), National Institutes of Health (Medical Education Partnership Initiative), Government (Netherlands-African the Dutch Partnership for Capacity Development and Clinical Interventions against Poverty related Diseases), and the University of Zimbabwe. The RSC aims to promote research by providing comprehensive research support services to **UZ-FHMS** researchers and beyond. The RSC contributes to the enhancement of research skills and creation of an environment that will allow successful and quality research work. This institutional report chronologically highlights the key activities from January to December 2023.

RSC 2023 ANNUAL REVIEW AND PLANNING MEETING (4-5 FEBRUARY 2023)


ICH-GCP TRAINING WORKSHOP (5-6 JULY 2023)

Ms T Mashaah participated in the Harmonization of Standards for ARSO Project Committee 1 on GRMP in Nairobi Kenya.









PRE-AWARD SUPPORT

The RSC identifies, and disseminates funding opportunity announcements (FOA), and supports researchers with grant application and awarding processes.



POST-AWARD SUPPORT

Currently, the RSC is managing 29 grants. The major funding agencies include the National Institute of Health (USA), Wellcome (UK), National Institute of Health Research, ELMA Foundation, and Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO) amongst others. The RSC database report from January to December shows there was a total of 1171 transactions that were done by the finance department which included cash, transfers, and international transfers for the various projects. During this period there were 24 financial reports, 6 interim reports, and a comprehensive RSC financial audit. All reports were accepted indicating compliance with all funder requirements.
